

## Frequently asked questions in regards of Hall Rent

1. Q: We will leave the community hall at noon. Do we still need to pay for a full day of rent?  
A: Yes, because we cannot rent out the hall on the same day to other renters.
2. Q: We will need the hall not before 6 pm at day of arrival. Do we still need to pay for a full day of rent?  
A: Yes, because we cannot rent out the hall on the same day to other renters.
3. Q: What is a PAL Insurance?  
A: **Party Alcohol Liability**. This insurance provides protection when lawsuits are brought against individuals, organizations or companies who host single/multi-day functions with alcohol service. Events with live entertainment OR sports **DO NOT** qualify for this policy. DJ's are not considered as live entertainment. This insurance is designed for Event hosts who are holding reception type events in a rented facility. A valid liquor permit or license must be in place for service of alcohol.
4. Q: If people are bringing their own alcohol and aren't using the bar or serving it, do they still require **PAL insurance**?  
A: Yes. Our Community Hall Insurance will be void if the renters do not have PAL insurance. For more information about PAL Insurance in Alberta please visit: <http://www.palcanada.com/en/special-events-liability> and/or check with your own insurance company.
5. Q: If people are bringing their own alcohol and are not using the bar or selling it, do you still require a **Liquor License**?  
A: To bring your own wine and homemade liquor products without having a Liquor License is only allowed at private residences, not community halls, banquet facilities etc. In that case people have to obtain a **Private (non-sale) license**. It allows the license holder to provide liquor to invited guests *free of charge*. You can obtain this license at any store who sells liquor. 6. Q: What do I have to do when I like to serve and sell alcohol during my event in the Community Hall?  
A: You can obtain a **Private (resale) license** at the time you buy the liquor. It allows the license holder to *sell liquor* to invited guests. For more information please visit: <http://www.aglc.gov.ab.ca/licences/specialevents.asp>
7. Q: What is your Legal Land Description for the PAL insurance?  
A: SE 27-33-7-W5M – Parcel: A 5159
8. Q: Is there an ice machine in the Hall?  
A: Sorry, there is no ice machine in the hall, but we have a freezer.
9. Q: Is there a cooler in the Hall?  
A: Yes, we have two large cooler for food storage in the west wing of the Hall close to the kitchen.

10. Q: Can we use candles on the tables?  
A: For insurance purposes only battery operated candles are allowed.
11. Q: How many tables are available, what is the size of the tables and how should they be handled?  
A: We provide 32 tables.  
Dimensions: 72" x 30" table top – 29 5/8" in height  
The table tops are made of high density polyethylene. Please **DO NOT stack the tables** after cleaning.
12. Q: Are dogs allowed on the property?  
A: Yes, dogs are allowed on the green space around the hall. But, please, make sure to clean up the "left over's" of your dogs before you leave. Dogs must be kept on a leash for their own safety and the public's safety. The properties bordering the hall have their own dogs and issues have happened with loose dogs.  
**Due to health regulations, dogs are not allowed in the hall.**
13. Q: Where can we dispose our garbage?  
A: Garbage like food leftovers, plastic containers, paper table cloth etc. can be disposed in the provided garbage bins in the Hall. **Please DO NOT leave any food outside of the hall because of wildlife!**  
Large items like broken furniture, large decoration items or mattresses etc. cannot be left on our Hall Grounds and in the garbage bins. The renter is responsible for the disposal of those items. In case they are left on the property the Damage Deposit is fortified.
